Assessments are student assessments used throughout a unit or course to monitor

progress toward learning goals and to guide instruction. Effective benchmark

assessments check understanding and application of knowledge and skills rather than

recall; consequently, effective benchmark assessments include performance tasks.

For the 2006-2007 school year benchmarks have been created on the Online

Assessment System that can be administered every nine weeks as pre/post diagnostic

assessments. These assessments should be utilized to modify instruction based on

individual student progress on standards. The third level of assessment is summative

assessments that are given at the end of a course or year of study such as the Georgia

Criterion Reference Competency Test (CRCT) or Georgia High School Graduation

Test (GHSGT).

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
