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#### What is a cohort?

A cohort is a group of educators with similar backgrounds and educational interests who collectively take courses on site, usually at a local school in their county or a neighbouring county. A cohort is usually comprised of 16-18 educators. This team of educators will be equipped to positively affect students and the educational community in their district.

#### What do we offer?

Master of Arts (MA) Degree in content fields; Early Childhood Education, Middle Grades Education (Math, Language Arts, Social Sciences and Science) or Secondary Education (Math, English, History and Science). Some teachers may wish to add a new field to an existing clear-renewable certificate. This degree will upgrade your certificate to a T-5.

Educational Specialist (EDS) Degree in Curriculum and Instruction; This degree will upgrade your certificate to a level S-6.

# How long does it take to earn a degree?

Your MA or EDS degree is designed to be completed in four semesters.

## Who can apply?

Teachers who have a clear-renewable certificate.

### What makes the Cohort concept advantageous for me?

• On site advisement, registration, instruction, and evaluation, "We come to you."

- The coursework is tied to local school improvement efforts, as well as an emphasis on your field of study.
- Assignments and research are directly related to teaching.
- Courses are taught by doctoral level, scholarly practitioners who are involved in the <u>real</u> world of education.
- Classes meet one night per week for 4 hours for a period of eight weeks during the school year. Summer classes are held during the day (with a scheduled "vacation" period.)

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# Piedmont College Financial Fast Facts

- Deadline to apply for the fall 2014 semester is April 1, 2014.
- There is no application fee to apply.
- Cost of the program:

MA - ECE and MG = 30 hour program = \$13,320 + \$100 graduation fee = \$13,420

MA - SEC = 36 hour program = \$15,984 + \$100 graduation fee = \$16,084

EDS - 30 hour program = \$13,320 + \$100 graduation fee = \$13,420

#### Detailed information for each semester:

MA - 4 semesters - typical schedule: 6 hours for spring, 9 hours for summer, 6 for fall, 9 for spring. ECE = 30 hours MG = 30 hours SEC = 36 hours Secondary candidates take 9 hours each semester. \$444 per credit hour

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EDS - 4 semesters - typical schedule: 9 hours for spring, 9 for summer, 6 for fall, 6 for spring. 30 hours at \$444 per credit hour

## Comparison between private and public Georgia institutions

Prior to 2008, the tuition gap between Georgia public and private institutions was steep. Due to cuts from the Board of Regents to public universities and colleges, student fees (in addition to tuition) have increased at public institutions.
