



ALL ABOUT TCC – ANSWERS TO COMMON QUESTIONS

What is a School Age and Youth Care Technical Certificate of Credit (TCC) and how can I earn it?

A School Age and Youth Care TCC is a certificate specific to school age and youth care. Its purpose is to provide knowledge, skills and attitude necessary to work effectively during out-of-school hours with children between the ages of 6 and 14 years. A minimum of 21 academic credit hours is required.

What are the requirements to enroll! in the TCC program?

You must have a high school diploma or GED equivalent, and meet the program admission requirements for the individual colleges.

Can the TCC count towards a degree or diploma?

Yes, some courses will transfer into a degree program, and courses may translate into a diploma program.

Is all coursework Bright from the Start: Department of Early Care and Learning (BFTS) approved?

Yes, all coursework for the TCC has been BFTS approved.
